APPELLATION: Pomerol

SURFACE AREA OF THE VINEYARD: 17.5 HECTARES (43 ACRES)

TERROIR: Clay-gravel and slightly sandy soils located on the south-east border of the famous Pomerol plateau

2010 VINTAGE

YIELD: 36 HL/HA

PRODUCTION: 52,800 bottles

BLEND: 75% Merlot / 25% Cabernet Franc

ANALYSIS DATA: 14° alcohol/total acidity: 3.65 g/l /pH: 3.60

WEATHER CONDITIONS

A relatively hot and dry spring.

A very dry summer, but without any excessively high temperatures. This enabled the grapes to ripen slowly and evenly, building up sugar levels while keeping record levels of acidity. The skins softened.

Cool September nights preserved this potential, and fine sunny days enhanced this phenomenon and helped the skins and pips to reach outstanding ripeness, while maintaining amazing balance.

MANUAL HARVESTING

29 SEPTEMBER TO 11 OCTOBER 2010, in excellent weather conditions.

VINIFICATION

Alcoholic fermentation: controlled temperature of 28° to 30°C.

Vatting time: 3 to 5 weeks.

Malo-lactic fermentation in new barrels for the best batches of Merlot and in vat for the Cabernet Franc.

AGEING

70% of the First Wine in new barrels for 21 months.

5 different cooper.





2010 VINTAGE

TASTING NOTES

Exhibiting an attractive, bright purple colour, this wine reveals lovely aromatic complexity and elegance. Notes of ripe fruit, gingerbread and violets mingle with subtle oak and a mineral touch. Very fine tannins come to the fore on the palate and develop with power, whilst keeping lovely freshness and amazing length of flavour. A wine with great breed and elegance, which will age well for many years. To be enjoyed in 10 to 20 years or beyond that!

Probably the château's greatest success of the last 20 years.
