SURFACE AREA OF THE VINEYARD : 17.5 hectares (43 acres)

AVERAGE AGE OF THE VINES: 35-40 years

TERROIR: Clay-gravel and slightly sandy soils located on the south-east border of the famous Pomerol plateau.

YIELD : 47 hl/HA

PRODUCTION : 54,000 bottles

BLEND : 65% Merlot / 35% Cabernet Franc

WEATHER CONDITIONS

A very dry spring.

Quite low temperatures in summer with some rain which tempered the excesses of drought in spring, favouring grape ripening.

Fine, sunny September weather with cool nights right up to the harvest.

MANUAL HARVESTING

12 TO 23 SEPTEMBER 2011, in excellent weather conditions.

VINIFICATION

Alcoholic fermentation: controlled temperature of 25° to 28°C.

Vatting time: 4 weeks.

Malo-lactic fermentation in new barrels for the best batches of Merlot and in vat for the Cabernet Franc.

AGEING

50% of the First Wine in new barrels for 18 months.

5 different coopers.





2011 VINTAGE

TASTING NOTES

This wine exhibits an attractive deep purple colour. Great complexity is shown in an aromatic bouquet of floral notes (violets), fruit aromas (blackcurrants) and hints of spice (cayenne pepper). The whole is enveloped in very delicate toasty aromas. The attack is smooth and unctuous; the tannins are round, juicy and spicy. Lovely volume on the palate is combined with power and freshness. The finish is long and displays the wine's great pedigree character.

This 2011 vintage is particularly well balanced thanks to excellent Cabernet Franc. Without question, you will derive great pleasure from this wine in 5 to 15 years' time.
