**SURFACE AREA OF THE VINEYARD :** 17.5 hectares (43 acres)

**AVERAGE AGE OF THE VINES :** 35 years

**TERROIR :** Clay-gravel and slightly sandy soils located on the south-east border of the famous Pomerol plateau.

## 2013 VINTAGE

**YIELD:** 17 hl/ha

**PRODUCTION:** 20,000 bottles

**BLEND:** 80% Merlot / 20% Cabernet Franc

**ANALYSIS DATA:** 13° alcohol / total acidity: 3.30 g/l / pH: 3.60

### WEATHER CONDITIONS

A wet spring with a risk of vine disease that was well kept in check thanks to our decision to convert to organic vine-growing. Normal dry and temperate summer. Unsettled weather at the beginning of autumn. Late ripening helped by fine sunny days.

### MANUAL HARVESTING

28 SEPTEMBER TO 9 OCTOBER 2013

With the help of very careful sorting.

### VINIFICATION

Alcoholic fermentation: controlled temperature of 25° to 28°C.


Vatting time: 3 weeks.

Malo-lactic fermentation in new barrels for the best batches of Merlot and in vat for the Cabernet Franc.

### AGEING

40% of the First Wine in new barrels for 16 months.

5 different coopers.





## 2013 VINTAGE

### TASTING NOTES

This 2013 vintage exhibits an attractive, bright purple hue. On the nose it reveals delicacy and charm with aromas of black fruits, sweet spices and fresh mint. Gently extracted tannins display good ripeness on a silky, harmonious and well-balanced palate followed by a lovely fresh finish. This is a wine with pedigree and elegance, which will definitely be pleasant to drink after 5 to 8 years' ageing in a good cellar.
